## Household Waste Disposal Guidelines

	Category	Items	Examples	Important Notes
	Combustible Waste Collection Day Every and	Food waste, wood, leather, etc.	Food waste, seafood shells, small pieces of wood, disposable diapers, leather products, etc.	<ul> <li>Thoroughly drain food waste of any excess liquid.</li> <li>You can dispose of individual items with each side of up to 60 cm.</li> <li>You can dispose of pieces of wood up to 5 cm in diameter.</li> </ul>
	Once a month 1st/2nd/3rd/4th	Old clothes, curtains, cotton blankets, etc.	Clothes, curtains, cotton blankets, etc. (large fabric items)	<ul> <li>Launder, fold, and place all items in a bag.</li> <li>If an item is dirty, remove all metal fittings and dispose of it as "Combustible Waste".</li> </ul>
	Containers and Packaging Plastics  Collection Day Every	Containers and packaging plastics  (PVC and plastic products marked with the 19 logo)	Egg cartons, containers for pudding and jelly, containers for cup noodles, food trays, supermarket checkout bags, retort (instant food) packages, bags for sweets, packaging nets for fruit, PET bottle lids, small bags for seasonings, Styrofoam, etc.	<ul> <li>Remove the contents and wash with water.</li> <li>Dispose of the lids and labels as "Containers and Packaging Plastics".</li> <li>Do not stuff checkout bags full of other items. Simply put them in the designated waste bag.</li> </ul>
-	PET Bottles  Once a month 1st/2nd/3rd/4th	PET bottles for alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages	PET bottles for soft drinks, mineral water, shochu, mirin, and soy sauce	<ul> <li>Peel off the labels.</li> <li>Remove stickers such as price tags wherever possible.</li> <li>Remove the contents and wash with water.</li> <li>Do not crush PET bottles.</li> </ul>
	Plastics Once a month 1st/2nd/3rd/4th	Plastic products and PVC products  (Plastics other than container and packaging plastics)	Toothbrushes, plastic buckets, washbasins, plastic toys, CDs, LDs, cups, etc.	<ul> <li>Remove any foreign matter and wash with water.</li> <li>Do not include items that are collected as recyclables, such as "PET bottles" and "container and packaging plastics".</li> <li>Dispose of items with metal fittings as "Non-Combustible Waste".</li> <li>Cut hoses and strings into pieces up to 30 cm in length.</li> <li>Dispose of items that are made of both plastic and paper as "Plastics".</li> </ul>
PERMITTY	Once a month 1st/2nd/3rd/4th	Bottles and cans	Bottles for soft drinks, soy sauce, vinegar, energy drinks, alcoholic beverages, instant coffee, etc., aluminum and steel cans for soft drinks, carbonated drinks, and alcoholic beverages, cans for canned goods, metal containers for sweets, seaweed, etc., bottles for cosmetics, etc.	<ul> <li>Be sure to remove the lids.</li> <li>Remove the contents and wash with water.</li> <li>Do not break bottles.</li> <li>Do not crush cans.</li> </ul>
	Non-Combustible Waste Once a month 1st/2nd/3rd/4th	Metals, ceramics, glass, other	Kitchen utensils such as pots, kettles, and spoons, lighters, bottle lids, ceramics such as rice bowls, glass products such as cups and plates, flower pots, plastics with metal fittings that cannot be removed, small electrical appliances, spray cans (such as insecticides and hair styling products), dumbbells, crowbars, hatchets, hammers, tools, hardened metals, etc.	<ul> <li>Broken glass is dangerous. Wrap it in newspaper and write "broken glass" on the outside.</li> <li>Items that contain residual chemicals or paint will not be collected.</li> <li>Items with long handles, such as umbrellas, may be disposed of with the handle extending outside of the designated bag.</li> <li>Remove batteries and dispose of them as "Harmful Waste".</li> <li>Completely use up and make a hole in spray cans before disposing of them.</li> <li>Do not wrap items other than breakables (glass, ceramics, etc.) in newspaper.</li> <li>Completely empty gas lighters before disposing of them.</li> </ul>
	Harmful Waste Once a month 1st/2nd/3rd/4th	Mercury thermometers, fluorescent lights, dry-cell batteries, incandescent light bulbs	Mercury thermometers, alkaline and manganese dry-cell batteries	<ul> <li>Place fluorescent lights in the boxes in which they were purchased, or wrap them in newspaper, to prevent them from breaking.</li> <li>Dispose of button cell and rechargeable batteries in the collection boxes at electronics stores or wristwatch stores whenever possible.</li> <li>Long fluorescent lights may be disposed of with the tube extending outside of the designated bag.</li> </ul>
	Paper Cartons  Collection Day Every	Paper cartons for beverages (H) (N) (H) (H) (H) (H) (H) (H) (H) (H) (H) (H	Milk cartons, etc. (Paper cartons without aluminum foil lining the inside)	<ul> <li>Wash cartons with water, cut them open, and allow them to air dry.</li> <li>Do not place paper cartons in designated bags. Tie them up in bundles with white paper string before disposing of them.</li> <li>Dispose of paper cartons with aluminum foil lining the inside as "Combustible Waste".</li> </ul>
Charlenge .	Newspapers Once a month 1st/2nd/3rd/4th	Newspapers	Newspapers	<ul> <li>Dispose of insert leaflets and flyers separately from newspapers, as "Other Paper".</li> <li>Tie newspapers up in bundles with white paper string before disposing of them.</li> <li>If a newspaper is wet or dirty, dispose of it as "Combustible Waste".</li> </ul>
THE RESERVE	Once a month 1st/2nd/3rd/4th	Cardboard	Cardboard	<ul> <li>Be sure to remove address stickers, delivery slips, and any tape or metal fittings before disposing of cardboard.</li> <li>Tie cardboard up in bundles with white paper string before disposing of it.</li> <li>If cardboard is wet or dirty, dispose of it as "Combustible Waste".</li> </ul>
	Other Paper Twice a month 1st/2nd/3rd/4th	Other paper	Magazines, paperback books, comic books, picture books, dictionaries, insert leaflets/flyers, catalogs, pamphlets, booklets, etc.	<ul> <li>Dispose of carbon paper, thermal paper (FAX paper), tissue, paper cups, and paper bags, etc. as "Combustible Waste".</li> <li>Tie other paper up in bundles with white paper string before disposing of it.</li> <li>If other paper is wet or dirty, dispose of it as "Combustible Waste".</li> </ul>
	Large Waste	Waste that does not fit in the designated bag	Furniture such as desks, chairs, chests of drawers, and sofas, aluminum sashes, sliding paper doors, rugs, futons, tatami mats, bicycles, microwave ovens, golf clubs, galvanized metal sheets, etc.	<ul> <li>Take large waste directly to the Recycling Plaza or Tojo Clean Center.</li> <li>If it is difficult for you to take large waste to a recycling location yourself, a door-to-door collection service is available. Reservation by telephone is required.</li> </ul>

- Please put your waste in the designated waste bags and take it to the designated collection site no later than 8 am on the collection day.
- Never dispose of waste at collection sites in other areas, or in locations where dumping is illegal. Waste that has not been separated or that has been placed in anything other than the designated bag, and hazardous materials such as gasoline, oil, paint, and chemicals will not be collected.
- Waste is not collected during the year-end and New Year holidays. Also note that collection days (weeks) in January might differ in some regions. Please check your collection calendar for details.
